LEGAL STANDARD

Florida Standard Jury Instructions for Premises Liability

Landowner or possessor's negligence toward invitee and invited licensee, whether the defendant...

N

Negligently failed to maintain the premises in a reasonably safe condition OR...

N

Negligently failed to correct a dangerous condition about which the defendant either knew or should have known by use of reasonable care OR...

N

Negligently failed to warn claimant of a dangerous condition about which the defendant had or should have had knowledge greater than the claimant. If so, whether such negligence was the legal cause of loss/injury/damage to injured person.



LOCAL ORDINANCES

You are still the owner and control the concrete

It is the responsibility of the property owner(s) abutting all sidewalks to clean the sidewalk and adjacent curb and gutter, including but not limited to, clearing debris, dirt, trash, vegetation, mold, mildew and other deleterious surface conditions. No vegetation shall be permitted to overhang the sidewalk to within a head room clearance of seven (7) feet. No obstruction shall be permitted within the width of the sidewalk within a head room clearance of seven (7) feet. The city shall be responsible for the repair of structurally damaged sidewalks only within city rights-of-way or public sidewalk easements. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owner to notify the city when the sidewalk is in need of repair.



2021 Case out of Middle District of Florida - Property owner prevailed on Summary Judgement

"The section of the sidewalk Kelley tripped over was an open, obvious, and otherwise harmless condition. The law imposes on a landowner the duty to mitigate unreasonable hazards on the property. It does not require the landowner to foreclose all risk that an invitee will injure himself during an inattentive moment."

RISK PREDICTION

Tort Reform March 24, 2023

Statute of limitation changed to 2 years for negligence Negligence standard change to modified comparative – if plaintiff is more than 51% at fault, they are barred from recovery



MICRO MOBILITY VEHICLES

- Micromobility devices.
- Florida has no maximum power limit.
- E-Bikes If they have pedals they are treated as bicycles

CLASS 1

A low-speed e-bike equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling. The motor stops assisting when the speed reaches 20 mph.



A low-speed e-bike that can be powered exclusively by its motor, with or without pedaling. The motor stops assisting when the speed reaches 20 mph.

CLASS 2 CLASS 3


An e-bike with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling. The motor stops assisting when the speed reaches 28 mph.



CITY BIKES OR PRIVATELY OWNED?

State Law says:

316.008 (7)(a) A county or municipality may enact an ordinance to permit, control, or regulate the operation of vehicles, golf carts, mopeds, motorized scooters, electric bicycles, and electric personal assistive mobility devices on sidewalks or sidewalk areas when such use is permissible under federal law. The ordinance must restrict such vehicles or devices to a maximum speed of 15 miles per hour in such areas.
